INFORMATION ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA AT STUK EVENTS AND TRAINING

3 Purposes of data processing

The purpose of the processing of personal data is to manage customer relations related to the events, networking sessions and training organised by STUK, and to make reservations related to events to plan appropriate service provision. The data may be used for drawing up a summary of the names and organisation of the event participants, which may be distributed to the participants together with the event programme and other accompanying material. If the summary of the names and organisations of the participants is distributed, a separate permission will be requested for this purpose in connection with registration. Personal data are processed in connection with contacts, service use, invoicing and feedback surveys.

4 Legal basis for processing

Agreement on participation in the event. The processing of personal data is based on consent or other separately mentioned grounds if the matter concerns an issue other than the organisation of an event or invoicing. The legal basis for the processing of accounting data related to invoicing is the legislation concerning the Budget.

5 Processed personal data or categories of personal data

Data relevant to the organisation of events and management of customer relationships, such as name, professional title, organisation, email address, telephone number, invoicing address and other data related to invoicing. Event participants may be asked to provide their date of birth and gender on behalf of a third party, such as a travel company. Participants may also be asked about their special dietary requirements and accommodation preferences in connection with catering and accommodation arrangements.

6 Where did the personal data come from?

From customer's registering for events.

7 Recipients or groups of recipients of personal data

We process data using the information systems of our service providers.

8 Will data be transferred outside the EU/EEA and to international organisations, or will these parties have access to data?

As a rule, no data will be disclosed outside the EU or the EEA or to international organisations. The necessary data of a STUK employee may be disclosed to international organisations or similar for the purpose of participation in an event.

9 Disclosure of Personal Data and Public Access

Upon request, STUK may disclose personal data in accordance with the Act on the Openness of Government Activities (621/1999).

10 Data retention period

Personal data are stored for at least the duration of the customer relationship and for as long as necessary for the purposes described in this privacy policy. For events concerning the provision of continuing training for professionals in the use of radiation, the name and organisation data are stored for five years. In other situations, the aim is to delete the personal data as soon as possible after the event. Data related to invoicing is stored in accordance with the legislation concerning the Budget.

11 Rights of the data subject

11.1 Right of access

The data subject has the right to obtain from the controller confirmation as to whether or not personal data concerning him or her are being processed, and, where such personal data are being processed, the right to access the personal data and to obtain information regarding the processing of the personal data.

11.2 Right to rectification

The data subject has the right to request that the controller rectify any inaccurate or incorrect personal data concerning the data subject without undue delay.

11.3 Right to erasure

An individual has the right to have their data erased, for example, if

- consent is withdrawn and there is no other legal basis for processing the data
- the purpose of the data's use or processing has ended

- the processing is unlawful

11.4 Right to restriction of processing

The data subject has the right to have the processing of their personal data restricted, for example, if the data subject disputes the accuracy of the personal data or if the processing of the personal data is unlawful.

11.5. Right to object

The data subject has the right to object to the processing of their personal data for direct marketing purposes.

The data subject also has the right to object to processing on grounds relating to his or her particular situation, which is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller, or where the processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller or by a third party.

However, the data may be processed for scientific or historical research purposes or for statistical purposes if this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest.

11.6 Right to data portability

The data subject has the right to transmit the personal data, which they have provided to a controller, to another controller, where the processing is based on consent or the processing is carried out by automated means.

The data may be transmitted directly from one controller to another, where technically feasible.

11.7 How do I submit a request for reviewing my personal data to STUK?

You can submit a request for reviewing your personal data, for example, using the Suomi.fi online service or by mail to STUK, Jokiniemenkuja 1, 01370 Vantaa.

We will respond to you as soon as possible, but no later than within one month.

12 Is the provision of personal data mandatory?

You cannot register for events without providing your personal data.

13 Withdrawal of consent

If the processing is based on consent, the data subject has the right to withdraw their consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out based on consent before the withdrawal.

14 Information on profiling or automated decision-making
